Jean-Charles de Lasteyrie - Chair of FEE Integrated Reporting Task Force and FEE Vice-President, member of FEE Executive

Jean-Charles de Lasteyrie is a graduate of ESCP Paris and holds a PhD in Tax Law. With René Ricol, they founded with Gilles de Courcel, the firm Ricol Lasteyrie in 1987. He has been elected to the Conseil Supérieur de l'Ordre des Experts Comptables from 2000 to 2004. During that period he was also President of the Club Fiscal des Experts Comptables and contributed to the 59th CPA convention in September 2004. He is Vice-President of FEE since 2009. He is founder member of the Association Professionnelle des Experts Indépendants (Apei) of which he has been elected President in May 2011.



Jim Singh - Executive Vice-President and Chief Financial Officer of Nestlé

Jim Singh is Executive Vice President and Chief Financial Officer of Nestlé S.A. with responsibility for Finance and Control, Treasury, Tax, Intellectual Property, Legal and Nestlé Global Business Services. Jim is also Chairman of the company Pension Committee. He served as Director of Nestlé Canada Inc. and Nestlé Capital Corporation, and as Trustee of Nestlé Education Trust. He has been with Nestlé since 1977. Born and educated in Guyana, he attended the University of Guyana. He holds an MBA from the University of Windsor, Ontario and is a Certified Management Accountant.



Richard Howitt, MEP, European Rapporteur on Corporate Social Responsibility

Richard Howitt MEP represents European interests in a number of international CSR initiatives, and serves as a Friend of the OECD Guidelines on Multinational Enterprises, a Member of the Governmental Advisory Group of the Global Reporting Initiative (GRI), an Ambassador for the International Integrated Reporting Committee and a member of the Public Policy Advisory Group of the United Nations Principles for Responsible Investment (UNPRI).

Alongside his work on CSR, Richard is Spokesperson of the Socialist and Democrat Group in the European Parliament on Human Rights. Richard is also a leading member of the European Parliament's Committees on Foreign Affairs, and on Employment and Social Affairs.



Paul Druckman - Co-Chairman of the IIRC Working Group

Paul Druckman is Chair of the Executive Committee of The Prince's Accounting for Sustainability Project and co-chair of the International Integrated Reporting Committee's working group. Since the late 1980s when Paul founded his first company, he has successfully owned, grown and sold a number of technology companies. Amongst his appointments Paul has been Chairman of Access Technology Group, President of the ICAEW, Director of the Financial Reporting Council and a member of the City Takeover Panel. He is currently Chairman of The Clear Group, M Institute and Fronesisys. Paul is also Chair of the FEE Sustainability Group.
